The global prevalence of diabetes\* among adults over 18 years of age rose from 4.7% in 1980 to 8.5% in 2014 (1). Between 2000 and 2016, there was a 5% increase in premature mortality from diabetes. The chance of having type 2 diabetes is closely tied to background.
