Error analysis in SLA was established in the 1960s by Corder and colleagues. Error analysis (EA) was an alternative to contrastive analysis, an approach influenced by behaviorism through which applied linguists sought to use the formal distinctions between the learners' first and second languages to predict errors.

The key finding of error analysis is that many learner errors are produced by the learners making faulty inferences about the rules of the target language. To overcome the shortcoming of contrastive analysis, it is suggested that teachers accompany contrastive analysis with error analysis.

The contrastive analysis model works best in predicting phonological error. However, errors of morphology, syntax, lexis and discourse are imperfectly predicted by contrastive analysis.

Error analysis is "a type of linguistic analysis that focuses on the errors learners make" (M.Gass & Selinker, 2008). This analysis is almost the same with the weak version of contrastive analysis which is comparing the errors which made by L2 learners.

In its strongest formulation, the contrastive analysis hypothesis claimed that all the errors made in learning the L2 could be attributed to 'interference' by the L1. However, this claim could not be sustained by empirical evidence that was accumulated in the mid- and late 1970s.

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Contrastive analysis a posteriori is said to be a subcomponent of the more encompassing field of error analysis.
